

STATE SCHOOLS TO SEND TEAMS MAY 31

Next Big Event on Aggies' Card is 12th Annual Inter-scholastic Meet.

The twelfth annual M. A. C. state inter-scholastic track and field meet is the next big event on the Michigan Aggie athletic card. The tourney, which brings to East Lansing athletes from every section of the state, is scheduled for next Saturday.

The state meet was not held last year because of the war, few inter-city meets have been held this spring because of meteorological conditions. As a result, picking winners is largely a matter of guess work and conjecture, have little or nothing to work with in their present calculations.

Between 25 and 40 of the representative high schools of the lower peninsula will send their best athletes to the annual Aggie inter-scholastic contest. Between 250 and 300 individual athletes will attend. Lansing Central was the first of the larger schools to return an entry blank. Brought was the first school to make application for a place on the M. A. C. schedule. Entry blanks will be received by 10 o'clock tomorrow the meet, and Coach George A. Gardner is confident the number will be near the 40 mark.

Detroit Eastern is believed to have one of the strongest teams in the state. Grand Rapids is boasting the caliber of athletes who will represent Central of that city at East Lansing. Other districts known are Northern Michigan, Eastern Michigan and others have not yet been received.

Saginaw to Liberty.

While the teams have not performed outside of Saginaw valley, the Saginaw and Bay City teams are likely to make a big strong bid for honors, judging from the records made in a dual city meet.

Grand Rapids Central was the highest field at M. A. C. in 1917.

The new features in the twelfth annual meet this year are the award of medals to fourth place winners and the re-classification of state schools into three, instead of two, classes. Trophies are awarded in each of the three classes. This change was made to stimulate interest in the state meet, among the smaller schools of the state. Class A comprises schools with an enrollment of 400 students or more. Class B is made up of schools with an enrollment of between 200 and 400 students. Class C is made up of schools with an enrollment of less than 200 students.

"The meet inter-scholastic and field meets ever held at M. A. C. due to the schedule of events during war athletics," said Coach Geo. Gardner.

Two cups are awarded which become the permanent property of the schools. Relay teams with a cup and several shields are given school place winners.

The track and field meet is the paramount feature of a big gala day at M. A. C. A band concert and case rush between yearlings and sophomores start the festivities the night previous to the meet. Saturday is state visitation day and President Frank Keefe has invited school officials of the entire state to be guests of the college on that day. All departments will maintain open hours and special exhibits are being arranged.
