Lansing, June 3.—Detroit Eastern won the annual Interscholastic track and field meet held at East Lansing Saturday by a half point margin with Battle Creek the close second. Twenty-four and one-half points was the highest score piled up.

Grand Rapids South placed fourth with 21 points while Central took seventh place with 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ points. Stemons of South was the star for the Furniture City tracksters taking third in individual honors with 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ points. He placed first in the 440-yard dash and fourth in the 220. De Ritter scored a first in the discus throw and second in the hammer. The South relay team took first place in the Class A run.

Price and Yoakey placed for Central while the relay team from that school was tied with Detroit Northwestern for second place.
