

Great Three Cornered Battle In M.A.C. Interscholastic

Central High Trackers Make Bitter Fight for Honors at M.A.C. Meet

EAST LANSING, Mich., May 31. — Kalamazoo high was third place winner with twenty-two and one-half points at the annual M. A. C. Interscholastic Track and Field meet at East Lansing, Saturday. Detroit Eastern won the meet with a half point lead over Battle Creek high school, until the last minute picked as winner of the meet. Detroit Eastern had twenty-four and one-half points and Battle Creek twenty-four points.

Platt was high point winner for Kalamazoo getting seconds in both the one hundred yard dash and the one-twenty hurdle.

He was tied with Neisch of Detroit Eastern for second place in the high jump. Another high point winner for Kalamazoo was Miller who took fourth place in both the hammer throw and the discus throw. Carr got third place in the one-mile run.

Wright won a third in the broad jump and Shepperd second in the broad jump.

HIGH POINT WINNER.

The high point winner of the meet was Turnbull, of the winning Detroit aggregation. He took firsts in both the hammer throw and the shot put and placed in the discus throw.

Hulscher of Battle Creek failed to place in the discus throw which cost the food city crew the meet. He had been third place winner at the Ann Arbor meet in this event.

The victory of Detroit Eastern came as a surprise as the school had won but one point in all the dashes, runs and hurdles. Later the school copped a last place in the class A relays.

A feature of the meet was the work of George Walker of Gobleville. He was the only man entered by this school but copped first in the 100 yard dash and the 220 yard run. He is a brother of the Walkers who have made track history for Kalamazoo college.

Because of the heat, no state interscholastic records were threatened.
