

Pole Vaulters Win Track Meet for Kazoo High

TAKES FINAL EVENT TO GIVE LOCAL ATHLETES HIGH SCORE.

When Galinder and Wheeler grabbed 4 3/4 points for Kalamazoo Central high, Saturday afternoon, in the pole vault, they enabled the local school to capture first place in the fifth annual Kalamazoo college interscholastic track and field meet.

Up to this point Highland Park high had it on Kalamazoo high, 24 points to 22 1/2, but the maroon and white pole vaulters raised Kazoo's grand total to 27 1/4, enough to cop first place.

The other schools winning points and their respective scores were: Cass City, 18; Detroit Central, 15; Battle Creek, 11; Detroit Northwestern, 13 1/4; Grand Rapids Central, 13; Wayland, 8; Hastings, 6 3/4; Grand Rapids South, 4; Crown Point, Ind., 3; Bangor, 2; Grand Rapids Union, 1; Plainwell, 3/4.

DETROIT CENTRAL BOY IS HERO

F. Jones, single entry from Detroit Central, scored firsts in the 50 yard dash, 100 yard dash and the 220 yard dash, Highland Park, third; Shoubel, the latter event and scoring 15 points single handed.

It proved to be a great day for record breaking, the marks for several events in this interscholastic being lowered. Bowen, Grand Rapids Central, cut the record for the mile run to 4:52 2-5. Weeks, of Battle Creek, ran the 880 in 2:07, or two seconds better than any previous performance. Highland Park high, in capturing the relay, cut 1 1-5 seconds off the time.

It was a great day in every way. Weather conditions were ideal and the competition was keen. There were big entries in all events, and the running of trial heats took a long time. The meet was well conducted and splendid entertainment furnished the visiting schools.
