

GOOD MARKS BEING MADE BY JUMPERS

Track and Field Records of
Previous Years Destined to
Be Broken.

IRONWOOD TO BE STRONG?

Sharp on the heels of the announcement that the Bessemer High school athletes bid fair to take high honors at the track meet to be held here in June, comes the report from headquarters of the Ironwood High that the Gogebic and Iron county scholars are going to get a lot of competition at the hands of the Ironwood gang.

Regular and systematic practice has been held for the last two weeks, and while it was believed for a while that the interest had lagged, it is apparently on an upward grade at the present time.

Clear Bar At Five.

Bergquist and Gribble have been clearing the bar at five feet in the running high jump, which is considered a pretty fair mark for High school students, particularly when it is compared with marks made in the recent Wisconsin meet of High schools, which was several inches below that. It is not at all improbable that in a week's time they will be able to make a better showing than five feet, according to the dopest of the High school athletics.

Dopp and Cvengros have already set a good standard in the running broad jump, making 18 feet and 2 inches and bidding fair to go even better than that. The best mark in 100 yards is held by Larson and Tederstrom who have sprinted down the cinder path in 11½ seconds.
