

Track Records Here Better Than Superior and Duluth

While Superior High school recently swamped the Duluth Central athletics in a track meet with a count of 77 to 27, the records made in the track and field meet do not compare favorably with those hung up by the youngsters of the Gogebic range in trial workouts thus far.

Superior won the half mile, Ward making it in 2:12, which is not fast time. The discuss throw was won by Superior, Hancock throwing the discuss 116.2. That mark is a fair one, but the pole vaulting, which was copied by De Santo of Duluth, was but 8.8 feet. High school students should go well over 9 feet with the pole, and it has been done in workouts on the

range.

The running broad jump was also won by Hancock of Superior, who set a mark of 17:5, which is more than six inches short of the mark made by Cvengros of the Ironwood High school in recent trials.

Running the 100-yard sprint in eleven seconds flat, Lyle Dopp has bettered in practice the mark of the Duluth-Superior field meet, which was 11 1-5. In the High jump, the Wisconsin-Minnesota contestants are far below the Ironwood, Wakefield and Bessemer athletes. They made but 4.1 feet, as compared with five feet already made by several students who will compete in the track meet here June 5.
