

WEEKES WINS IN HALF-MILE EVENT

Battle Creek High School Track Captain Victorious at Ann Arbor Yesterday.

"Bill" Weekes of the Battle Creek High school had the best showing of the season in the half-mile run at Ann Arbor yesterday, making the extraordinary time of two minutes, one and one-eighth seconds all over the course. He was the only runner in the event to finish in the one and one-eighth range.

Weekes is the son of Mr. and Mrs. W. C. Weekes of North Union street, Battle Creek who took second place in the run in the one who had won at Chicago recently. The race was run on the track at the new indoor stadium at the University of Michigan Saturday and finished with about a two yard lead.

Weekes, also of the local high school, placed in the finals of the 220 low hurdles, making second place.

Ann Arbor, Mich., May 22.—United States High School of Chicago won the annual University of Michigan inter-school track and field meet here today with a total score of 117 points. The Chicago school's team secured 12 points above where they would have been enough to carry off the taking bid for second place with 14 points.

One Michigan inter-school meet and was broken when Edna of Lafayette school, Detroit, took the title in 4:12.

Other teams finished in this order: Detroit Northwestern 75, East, 65; and Battle Creek, 57; Chelsea, 7; Lafayette, 10; and Grand Rapids, 14.

The 200 yard hurdle contest was won by Detroit Northern and Grand Rapids, 14; Grand Rapids Central, 13; Lansing 13; and Ann Arbor 12.
