

# FINAL RESULTS OF TRACK MEET

## Field Day at Pickford Success in Every Way.

The first high school track meet ever held in Chippewa county was a marked success in every way. The elemental conditions were perfect, it being warm, with little or no breeze.

The day's program began at 9 o'clock when the Soo Junior High boys battled with the Pickford baseball team. Although at some stages of the game the Junior High boys showed consistent playing they could not keep the Pickford nine from pounding the leather, as a result the Junior High lost 17-7.

The next game, between Soo Hi and DeTour, proved to be a run-away for Bemer's men. Lehman for DeTour, pitched a good game but received no support whatsoever. The Soo won the game by a large score.

At one-thirty entrants for races were listed and the track teams were soon struggling for the Chippewa County banner. Of all races the mile relay was the most exciting. Just Pickford and the Soo entered this race and amid the cheers and encouragements of the crowd the relayers strained every nerve and muscle to win. The last quarter saw the Soo man about two rods in the lead, when Morrison for Pickford hit the trail on the home stretch. Morrison gained slow but sure and in the last five yards nosed by the Soo runner, winning by the width of his body, for Pickford.

The final baseball game, to be played by Su Hi and Pickford for the county championship, was forfeited to the Soo and a team was made up by selecting nine diamonders from the DeTour and Pickford teams. The result of the game, though hotly contested from the beginning, was 11-4 in favor of the Soo.
