

IRONWOOD HIGH WINS TRACK, FIELD MEET

Dopp and Gotta Tied for First Place as Individual Point Getters.

ALSO TIED FOR SECOND

With a total of 12 points, Ironwood's high school squad topped first place in the Copper Range track and field meet, held here yesterday afternoon at the Ironwood track. The honor points amount to 12 for Ironwood, with 14. All schools make a contest showing and results published in the recent North-Superior high school were broken here.

The meet point getter for Ironwood, and Gotta, Bennett's war were tied for first place with 10 points each. It is probable that each will be given a silver medal and that Carter of Wakefield and Dugga of Zimmerman also were tied for second with each get a bronze medal.

In the 100-yard dash in 13 1/2 seconds, which was new field of 1 second better, time than made by the South-Superior contestant. The high jump mark of 4 feet and 1 1/2 inches, which was won by Bennett of Ironwood, was more than two inches better than the South-Superior mark.

It was tight all the way through between Gotta and Dopp in one which would give the most points. Dopp took first in the 100 and Gotta finished second. Gotta finished second in the 100 foot and 100 yard. In the 200 Dopp got first and Gotta second. In the 400 Gotta got first and Dopp second. In the 800 Gotta got first and Dopp second. In the 1600 Dopp got first and Gotta second. In the 3200 Gotta got first and Dopp second. In the 6400 Dopp got first and Gotta second. In the 12800 Dopp got first and Gotta second.

The mile walking was an easy victory for Pierce of Ironwood, who apparently didn't have to exert himself and won with the low mark of 7 feet and 4 inches. The high jump was a good contest and for a while it appeared that Gotta and Bennett would win, but Bennett stepped ahead and Gotta lost out entirely, the latter finishing second from Wakefield, Carter finishing third.

The events were in splendid shape due to the efforts of the Board of Public works in cooperation with the officials in charge. The meet was originally arranged by the Y. M. C. A. which is attributed as a reason for the failure of the Starry High school track and field contestants to be given by the Ironwood board of education and the Copper Range club of the University of Michigan. Charles Carter, Ironwood; Fred Trovian, Copper Range; and L. A. Miller of Wakefield each selected men under the high school and one for track events. Fred Trovian served as starter and W. Dyer, Jr. R. Mills and U. T. Duffield were timers.

A good crowd turned out and because of the enthusiasm shown, it is believed the affair will be made an annual one, the next meet to be held in either Zimmerman or Wakefield.
