

# SETRIGHT WINS 100-YARD DASH AT W. S. N. MEET

**Jackson High School to  
Enter Track Meet at  
Ann Arbor Next Satur-  
day.**

Raymond Joseph Setright, star Jackson high school, continued winning events and tying records, when he captured the 100-yard dash at the W. S. N Interscholastic track meet Saturday from a field of over 60 starters representing 37 high schools.

Not only did Setright win the event but in the first heat tied the track record by making the distance in 10 1, which mark has stood since 1915 Setright's time for the final heat was 10:2. "Set" was set back a yard in the second heat despite this finished 6 feet ahead of the field in every heat.

Setright also made a creditable showing in the broad jump and but for fouls in his two trials would have captured this event also. 'Set' made better than 21 feet in both of the first trials, but was disqualified both times. Gainder of Kalamazoo and Snyder of Northwestern tied for first place in this event with a mark of 20 feet 3 inches.

## JAGNOW MAKES 5:2

Jagnow and McCain were the entries from Jackson in the high jump but failed to win any points. Jagnow topped the pole at 5 feet 2 inches but did not place. Pritchard of Allegan was first with 5 feet 7 inches.

Jackson High is planning to send a team of 15 track men to the meet at Ann Arbor next Saturday and Coach Pearl will give his athletes some training this week instead of taking them to the meet out of condition. Schools from all over the country will compete in this event reports indicate that Setright will have some tough opposition in a 100-yard runner from Buffalo. A number of New York schools are entered in Saturday's meet.

## "SET" IN THREE EVENTS

"Set" is entered in three events at Ann Arbor, the 100 and 225 dashes and the broad jump. Yesterday was "Set's" first attempt at jumping in four years and with a little practice the local star should give any of the entries a real argument for first place.

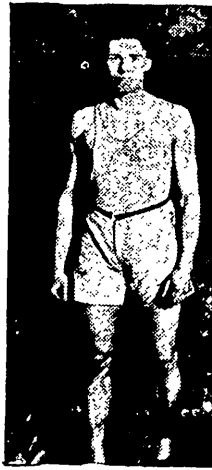
