

Record Entry List for Interscholastic Closed

Lansing High School Considered Strong Contender for Meet Honors at Aggie Saturday; Sixty-Three Schools Send Squads to East Lansing.

Sixty-three schools and nearly 600 individual athletes compose the entry list for the fitteenth annual State Interscholastic track meet to be held on the Michigan Aggie track and field Saturday. This entry exceeds the list of the largest meet ever held in the state before by 25 exhects

All preliminary heats, including those in the 100-yard dash, the 220-yard dash, the high and low hurdles, will be run off in the morning starting at 10:30. Finals in all events will be staged in the afternoor.

In each event, Class C will compete first, Class B second, and Class A third. Entries in the events will be given first and second calls and will be required to meet the clock in reporting for participation.
