

Fifteenth Annual Interscholastic In Session at Michigan Aggie Field

Every train coming into Lansing during the last 24 hours has been bringing high school athletes to the Fifteenth Annual State Interscholastic Track meet now in progress at College field. Many of the high school teams were split up so that sprinters and hurdlers arrived in East Lansing yesterday afternoon to be on hand for trial heats this morning, while middle distance, distance and field event entries remained behind until today.

Breaking all state records for team and individual entries, today's meet stands out as the principal high school athletic event of the year in Michigan. In ability of competitors as well as numbers, the meet is setting a new standard for the state, also.

At 10:30 this morning all entries in the century dash were scheduled to be on the field ready for the trial heats, hurdlers and the 220-yard dash being next on the slate. As in final heats, separate trials were to be run in each class.

The afternoon's program was announced to start promptly at 1:30 with the final heat of the 100-yard dash for Class C. From that time on one running event was to be staged every five minutes, the last one, a half-mile relay for Class A schools slated to start at 4:30. Field and weight events were to be run off in the meantime, and the entire meet was planned to close before 4:45. Last year's Interscholastic was run off exactly on time to the minute and Athletic Director C. L. Brewer, manager of this year's games, was confident that the trick could be repeated this year.


Specials from Charlotte, St. Johns, Hastings and a number of other nearby towns brought scores of high school students and followers of the team to the scene of the annual games while motor cars and trains added to the number of people coming from out of the city to witness the meet. Detroit, Grand Rapids, Highland Park, Ypsilanti and a number of other schools with chances of winning the meet were assured especially good backing by their own followers.

Lansing high, with 20 men entered, was expected to fare much better in the Michigan Aggie meet than it has in other track affairs where conditions were not so ideal for it. That the local athletes would be able to cut a big slice out of the total scoring in Class A was the belief prevalent on the campus.
