

# PREP HARRIERS MEET AT YPSI

## State Schools Compete in Cross-Country Run Arm- istice Day.

Ypsilanti, Nov. 2.—Lloyd W. Olds, of the Michigan State Normal college, announces a state high school cross-country run to be held at Ypsilanti, Saturday, November 11, at 11 a. m.

It will be the first state high school championship run staged in the state. Invitations have been sent to the principal high schools in the state, and it is hoped that other schools than those invited will enter. All entries must be in the hands of Olds not later than Friday, November 10, at 12 o'clock. The entries will be for a six-man team.

A big cup will be presented to the team which succeeds in placing five men first. A gold medal will be given the winner of first place and a silver one to the winners of second and third places. Bronze medals will be awarded to the next four men who place.

It is hoped to make this an official Michigan Interscholastic association run. The course will consist of from two and one-half miles to two and three-quarter miles. Cross-country running is rapidly becoming a sport in the high schools throughout the state. All but two Detroit high schools have entered teams. Detroit Northwestern, Southeastern, Northern and Eastern have entered, and it is expected that the other two will also be represented.

Ann Arbor and Kalamazoo have also been entered. Battle Creek is expected to enter its team as it is one of the schools where cross-country has been made a major sport.
