

Harold Davis, of Colt Squad, Breaks 440 Record and Equals Best Time for 220; Prout Does 10 Ft. 6 1-16 In. in Pole Vault.

NORTHWESTERN High won its fourth straight city track championship at the Armory Saturday evening with a total of 42½ points to 20½ for Central High, in second place, and 18½ for Cass Tech. in third.

Winning the track meet gave the Colts possession of the Central High "C" Club trophy, which was offered this year for the first time.

Northwestern won because it had a well balanced team. The Red and Gray athletes placed in every event except the 30-yard low hurdles. First position in four events and the relay were practically enough to give Northwestern victory. However, the Colts took enough seconds, thirds and fourths to run their total far ahead of the other schools competing.

SEVERAL RECORDS FALL.

The meet was a complete success in that two city records and one state mark were broken and one city record equalled. Harold Davis, of Northwestern, broke the record for the 440-yard and equalled the 220 mark. Prout, of Central High, broke both the city and state scholastic records in the pole vault, fracturing the former by three and one-sixteenth inches and the state mark by one-sixteenth of an inch.

Davis was expected to take the 440 from his chief rival, Marshall McCausland, of Eastern. The latter was out, however, because of illness. It was also figured that Davis had a chance to break the mark of 58 3-5 seconds, which he had set last year. His new mark is 58 1-5 seconds.

It was not thought that Davis would win the 220 from George "Buck" Hester of Northern High, who last year set new state records for 100 and 220 yards, especially since Davis had only a few minutes before the 220. Davis ran his record, breaking 440.

Despite this unbelief Davis stepped out and fought Hester all the way, took the lead from him and won by a good yard margin, equaling the mark of 26 3-5 seconds, made by Carl Blauman, of Northwestern, in 1921.

PROUT'S RECORD VAULT.

Prout showed good form in the pole vault, setting a new mark of 10 feet 6 1-16 inches, the old city record being 10 feet 3 inches. The mark also was one-sixteenth of an inch better than any state school boy had made in competition.

Cass Tech stepped to the fore early in the meet with first places in both the high and low hurdles, a second in the mile and third and fourth in the quarter. Bill Meyers, of Cass Tech, took both hurdle events, and was fourth in the 220. He was high point winner of the meet.

With these events completed Cass Tech fell back and first Northwestern and then Central passed the Mechanics in the standing.

The showing of Central was a moral victory, for the Cass Avenue School. Last year the Trailblazers had one of the weakest track teams in the city. In one season they have been able to come up from nowhere to the runner-up position.

CENTRAL COMES UP.

Central showed several good performers who appear 'good' for first places whenever they start. Sutton looks like the best miler in the city, and Paul seems to be the best half-miler. Johnston is the leading high jumper, and Prout is far superior to to the schoolboy field in the pole vault.
