

STAMP PREPS' MEET SUCCESS

**Greater Detroit Championship
Affair Run Off in Com-
mendable Fashion.**

**Performance of Athletes Indi-
cates More Good Records
at Ann Arbor.**

Success is the stamp placed on the second annual Greater Detroit track and interscholastic championship track and field meet which was held last Saturday at Godd field.

From the competitive as well as the executive angle, the meet met all requirements. Events were run off on time, delays were reduced to the minimum, and the officials were right up to snuff in keeping every thing moving at the necessary rate. Much praise is offered for the track itself. Despite the soaking it received from almost a week of continuous rainfall, its drainage system carried away the water almost as rapidly as it collected on the cinders and when the rain did let up, it required only a few hours for the course to be in condition.

Show Boys' Ability.

The success of the athletes in breaking so many records is a tribute to the prowess of Detroit schoolboys when they are favored by adequate training facilities. A year ago there was one track in the city on which they could practice. This spring there are three, making systematic training possible. The results attained are sufficient evidence.

And by their Saturday performance, Detroit athletes are favored to slice records in the next two meets on their program, the Michigan interscholastic at Ann Arbor Friday and Saturday and the state championship affair at East Lansing in June.

Clear Simpson, Northwestern, is sure to bring home some points in the weights, particularly the ebb, **George Hester, Northern, should** place in one of both dashes even if he fails to win first. **Emil Voelker, Eastern, who went 22 feet 2 inches** in the broad jump, three feet shy of the world's record held by **Scott Gourdin, Harvard university, cannot** fail to break into the summaries.

INDIANS DEFEAT COLT ATHLETES BY 1-2 POINTS

Northern's Victory Over Colts in Relay Give Meet to Orange-Black.

TEN RECORDS BROKEN

Only Two Old Marks Left on Books When Affair Ends.

Ten records sent to the discard, the disbandment of Northwestern as the Detroit intercollegiate Blue by Eastern, several records, moreover, the second annual Greater Detroit meet held yesterday afternoon at Codd field.
