


MURRAY BREAKS TRACK RECORDS

Gets the Honors of the Inter-scholastic Meet at Kalamazoo Yesterday.

Pritchard of Allegan Jumps Five Feet, Ten and Half Inches in New Record.



Dean Murray, senior in Battle Creek high school, broke the interscholastic record of the state when he ran the class A mile in 4 minutes, 42.5 seconds at the annual meet held at Kalamazoo college yesterday.

After doing this he was hurried home in a car to take part in the Flint-Battle Creek baseball game. Murray is certainly a great athlete and one of which the high school can well be proud. In a recent meet held in Chicago at Northwestern University Murray took second place but was disqualified through no fault of his own. Battle Creek finished twelfth in the meet in which 24 schools of Michigan and Indiana participated.

The Associated Press Kalamazoo, Mich., May 6.—Highland Park high school of Detroit won high honors in the annual interscholastic track and field meet staged here this afternoon by Kalamazoo college. The meet was the most successful one put on here in years. Nine records were broken and one was established. Twenty different schools scored points.

The standings of the teams and their points scheduled was as follows: Highland Park, 27; Albion 17 1/2; Rockford, 15; Saginaw East, 14; Farmington, 13; Kalamazoo, 12; Niles, 11; South Bend, Ind., 10; Grand Rapids Central, 10; East Lansing, 10; Ann Arbor, 8; Okemos, 7; Battle Creek, 5; Goblesville, 5; Saginaw Arthur Hill, 4; Hartsville, 3; Muskegon, 2; Delta, 2; Howe, Ind., 2; Benton Harbor, 1 1/2.

Pritchard of Allegan was high individual point winner with 10.25 points.

Doyle of Kalamazoo and Emerson Berry of Saginaw Eastern, were next best with ten points for each.

Records were made in nine events and a record was established in the one 1/2 mile. In the 125-pound shot put Doyle of Kalamazoo, raised his own record to 44 feet, 7 inches. He also set a new record in the discus by heaving it 116 feet, 5 inches. In the pole vault, Thorpe of Highland Park, established a new record by going up 11 feet, five inches, bettering the old mark by six inches.

In the high jump Pritchard of Allegan, jumped five feet, ten and a half inches, a new record. Emerson Berry of Saginaw Eastern, flashed the 100 yard dash in ten seconds, lowering the old record by three-fifths. Murray of Battle Creek, ran the class A mile in 4:42.2, which cuts down the previous mark by nine seconds. In the high hurdles, Foster of South Bend ran 17 feet, which is record time. In the low hurdles, Bell, of Highland Park, lowered the time to 28.2. The class B, relay time was decreased to 1 minute, 46 seconds by Rockford high school.
