

## STATE TRACK MEET ON TODAY

**Battle Creek and 21 Other High Schools Entered in Class A Division at Lansing.**

East Lansing, Mich., June 2.—Hundreds of high school athletes gathered here today to compete in the annual state interscholastic track and field meet at the Michigan Agricultural college. Twenty-two of the largest schools in the state had teams entered in the class A contest, 11 teams represented class B schools and scores of athletes were the colors of smaller class C schools.

The entries in class A were: Ann Arbor, Battle Creek, Benton Harbor, Detroit Cass Tech, Detroit Central, Detroit Eastern, Detroit Northwestern, Flint, Grand Rapids Central, Grand Rapids Union, Hamtramck, Highland Park, Jackson, Kalamazoo Central, Lansing, Monticomee, Muskegon, Pontiac, Saginaw, Arthur Hill and Saginaw Eastern.

In class B were: Oronoso, St. Johns, Coldwater, Monroe, Sturgis, Hillsdale, Birmingham, Niles, Greenville, Marquette, Alton, Allegan, Easton Rapids and Hastings.

The meet will last through Saturday with preliminaries in many events scheduled for 4 o'clock this afternoon. Detroit Northwestern and Detroit Eastern, in view of their performance in the Ann Arbor meet a week ago were favored to win the class A championship. Allegan and Niles were looked upon as strong contenders for the class B trophies. A total of 55 schools of all classes was represented.

Six Battle Creek men will compete in the state track meet being held in East Lansing this afternoon and tomorrow. Dean Murray, who has won first place for the mile in two of the three state meets held so far this year, and third place in the other, will probably be Battle Creek's brightest luminary in the contest. He and Gerald Horn will enter in the mile in East Lansing and will meet the two men who beat Murray in the last meet. One of the men is Gordon Hills of Mt. Clemens, and the other is an Ann Arbor man.

The other Battle Creek men to enter are: LaVerne Scanlan, who will enter in the half mile; Wayne Schroeder in the 120-yard high hurdles, Fred Beal in the 220-yard low hurdles, and Earl Stine in the discus throw. Some of the men who will have to take part in the preliminary to be held this afternoon, while those who will not take part until tomorrow are to leave tomorrow morning.

John Sterling, who has been training the team, said this morning that Battle Creek has practically no chance of winning the meet, but that one or two men may star individually.
