

TRACK MEET WON BY SENIOR TEAM

Were Victors in Inter-class
Event by Majority of 24
Points, in Eight Events.

Seniors claimed first place in the inter-class track meet yesterday afternoon at the high school gymnasium by a majority of 24 points.

Throughout the eight events of 20 yard dash, 440 yard dash, running high jump, 220 yard dash, pole vault, 880 yard dash, running broad jump and the mile run, there was a close opposition for the first and second places. In the running high jump three men were tie for second place and in the 220 yard dash three men were tie for first place.

Beal and Diller won the most points of the meet. Both won 13 points. Beal is a senior and Diller a sophomore. The latter won all the points accredited to the sophomores.

The seniors scored first place by a total of 37.23 points, the sophomores scored second by 13 points, the freshmen scored third by 10.13 points and the juniors came out last by a score of 9 points.

In the 20 yard dash the highest time made was 2.8 seconds. Beal, a senior, took first place, Garrett, also a senior, took second and Smith, a junior, took third.

In the second event, a 440 yard dash, the time made was 61.8 seconds. Beal took first place; Galehouse, a freshman, took second place, and Rogers, a senior, took third place.

The third event was the running high jump, the highest height made was 5 feet 3 inches. Diller, a sophomore, took first place and Dodge, a senior, Dozier, a freshman, and Garrett, a senior, were tied for second and third places.

The fourth event was an absolute standard. This event was the 220 yard dash. The time made was 23 seconds. Rogers, a senior, Beal, a senior, and Skidmore, a junior, were tie for first, second and third places.

The fifth event was the pole vault. The height made was 9 feet. Garrett, a senior, took first place; Diller, a sophomore, took second, and Lewis, a senior, took third place.

The sixth event was the 880 yard dash. The time made was 2 minutes, 21.1 seconds. Scanlan, a senior, took first place, Galehouse, a freshman, took second, and Calkins, a senior, took third.

The seventh event was the running broad jump. The greatest distance jumped was 18.6 feet. Smith, a junior, took first place, Dozier, a freshman, took second, and Garrett, a senior, took third.

The eighth event was the mile run. The time made was five minutes and 45 seconds. Only two men ran in this run, Diller taking first place and Spaulding, a senior, taking second.

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
