

### B. C. HANGS UP THIRD VICTORY

Wins, Yesterday Afternoon, from Kalamazoo in Inter-city Track Meet.

**GARRETT PROVES STAR**

Grab Total of 16 Points—Local Team Wins First and Second in Eight of Ten Events.

Battle Creek high school scored the third victory of the season against teams representing Kalamazoo High, yesterday afternoon, the inter-city track meet held in the local gymnasium by a 17-17 score. Local athletes took first and second places in eight of the 10 events. Yesterday's victory adds to the sequence of wins over Kalamazoo, this season, local teams winning in football and basketball, and a victory in baseball, this spring, will round out a full season.

Garrett, of Battle Creek, scored the highest number of points run up by any entrant in the meet, 16. Diller, a local athlete, came second with 11. Cooley, of Kalamazoo, with a total of eight points, was high point winner for the opponents and took third place in the scoring. Winners of first places were credited with five points, three points were awarded for second place, and one point for third place.

Garrett of Battle Creek won the first event of the afternoon, the 20 yard dash, in 2.4 seconds; Hathway, Kalamazoo, second; and Thurston, Kalamazoo, third.

The 40 yard dash was run in 6.4 seconds; Beal, Battle Creek, winner; Rogers, Battle Creek, second and Cooley, Kalamazoo, third. 22.4 seconds for a win in the half mile run. Gabehouse, Battle Creek, second, and Thurston, Kalamazoo, third.

The fourth event was the running high jump. Diller and Garrett were tie for first and second places in this event. The height jumped was 5 feet 4 inches. Sternfock and Hathway, both of Kalamazoo, were tied for third place.

The fifth event was the 220 yard dash. Kalamazoo succeeded in taking first place in this event. Cooley won first place and the time made was 7.1 seconds. Rickmore took second place and Beal took third.

The sixth event was the pole vault. Garrett and Diller were again tied for first and second places in this event. The height that they succeeded in jumping was 8 feet and 3 inches. Cooley of Kalamazoo took third place.

The seventh event was the running broad jump in which Smith exceeded all of his previous records by jumping 19 feet 2 inches. Smith, of Battle Creek, took first place. Garrett, second, and Cooley third.

The eighth event was the mile run, the first two places of which Battle Creek again claimed. Horn took first place making a time record of 5 minutes 7.1 seconds. Diller came second and Bradford of Kalamazoo came third.

The ninth event was the relay race which was won by Battle Creek. The relay race was finished off by Rickmore who seemed to have a tie that was set up between the previous pairs of runners.

The tenth event was supposed to have been the shot put but was forfeited by the Battle Creek team because of the lack of material to take part in this event.

The next meet will be held at Kalamazoo Wednesday, Feb. 22.
