Prout equalled the city mark of 412 seconds for the high hurdles and was only a fifth of a second away from the record of 4 seconds flat in the low hurdles. His best performance of the evening was in the pole vault, however. The Central athlete took first in the pole vault at 10 feet 6 inches. The city record established by Prout himself last year was a sixteenth of an Inch higher. On his next try the bar was raised three inches to 10 feet 9 inches and this height was cleared setting a new city record. The bar was raised three inches again, this time to 11 feet at which height Prout had established a new state record at the meet at M. A. C. last Saturday. Prout missed on his first try but cleared the bar on his second. He then requested the officials to raise the bar again in order to set a new 18 state record. Northwestern failed to place in the relay when its second man, Lawson Parker, fell on the track and turned his ankle. He was carried from e. the floor. The race that created the most interest was the half-mile, in which two Eastern runners. Brown and Houghton, battled for first place. It was a real battle on the last two laps between the two Indian runners, and at the finish Brown was just inches in front of Houghton after having set the pade for the greater part of the race.
