COLTS SET RECORD IN RELAY RACE BUT IT WILL NOT BE OFFICIAL

Only Two Watches Catch Time at 1:31 8-10, Best Mark Ever Made in a High School Meet.

East Lansing, June 9.—Scoring in nine events Detroit Northwestern won the highest crown in the high school competition of the state by walking away with the 17th annual meet of the Michigan Interscholastic association with 33 1-3 points. Lansing was second with 19 points and Detroit Eastern third with 15 points.

The other scores were: Detroit Northern, 13 1-3; Saginaw Arthur Hill, 12; Detroit Central, 11 1/2; Detroit Western, 11; Detroit Cass Tech, 8; Ann Arbor, 8; Highland Park, 6; Saginaw Eastern, 6; Muskegon, 2; Grand Rapids Central, 3; Jackson, 2 1/2; Detroit Southeastern, 2; Pontiac, 1-3.

SEVERAL RECORDS BROKEN.

Records were broken with regularity throughout the meet, the Detroit Northwestern relay team establishing a new record in the last event of the day that is close to or better than all existing marks. It will not be considered official, however, because the eight watches present were scattered over four teams, leaving but two to record the first place winners. Their time by the two watches was 1:31 8-10. The two watches held on Lansing, second place team, showed 1:32 4-10.

Hester of Detroit Northern and Leschensky of Detroit Northwestern put up the greatest battle of the day when the former won the 220-yard dash by a matter of an inch or two in the unusual time of :21 7-10. Hart of Saginaw Arthur Hill also displayed unusual ability in winning the half mile in a new record time.
