

DERRELL SMITH OUT-JUMPS ALL

Wins First Place at Inter-scholastic at Ann Arbor Against Country's Best.

MANY RECORDS BROKEN

Stiff Wind Pounding Runners' Backs Causes Judges to Disallow Time.

Derrell Smith, Battle Creek high, who smashed the interscholastic record at Kalamazoo this spring, put his school on the map again yesterday when he outjumped the pick of the country with a leap of 21 feet 7 1-8 inches. It was the greatest jump Smith ever made. Smith scattered the dirt at Kalamazoo 20 feet 6 inches from the take off but beat that feat by a foot and an inch and an eighth.

Smith's jump was the only first Battle Creek brought home although the race which Wayne Schroder ran in the high hurdles was a memorial event. He placed fourth in a record breaking contest won by Baldwin of Wichita Falls, Tex., who broke the Michigan record at Ann Arbor. The record, however, was not allowed to stand owing to the favorable wind which blew on the backs of the runners.

Deland Davis qualified for the high jump, getting into the finals and then losing to that same Baldwin who nosed Schroder out in the high hurdles.
