

**ESKIMO GIRLS
WIN ON TRACK**

Northern Takes Honors in Second Annual City Meet, Beating Eastern.

Two Records Fall in Hardest Contested Event in History of Schools.

Northern high school won the second annual girls' track and field meet Wednesday afternoon at Codd field, nosing out Eastern by a margin of one point, 16 to 15.

The contest was the hardest fought of any track meet held in the city and the winner was not decided until the final event, when the Eskimos took second place. This gave them enough points to offset the advantage held by Eastern prior to the relay.

The Indian maidens were leading by five points when the runners were called for the relay event. Eastern failed to place and Northern took second, which allowed them six points and enough to annex the title.

Two new records were established during the afternoon. The first mark to go by the boards was the high jump. Miss Ortwein won the event with a leap of 4 feet 5 3/4 inches, bettering the mark held by Loretta Nietzel, of Northeastern.
