

**COLTS FAVORED
IN STATE MEET**

**Detroit Northwestern, Winner
of Track Test in 1923,
Expected to Repeat.**

**Twenty-two Schools Entered
in Sixteenth Annual Test
at M. A. C.**

East Lansing, June 4.—Twenty-two high school teams, including eight from Detroit, will be entered in the sixteenth annual state inter-scholastic track meet for Class A schools, to be run off on the Michigan Aggie track Friday and Saturday, June 6 and 7.

Detroit Northwestern, winner of the cup in 1923, is favored to repeat in view of the strong showing of the Colts in the earlier meets this spring.

Chief competition for Northwestern is expected to come from schools out in the state, Lansing and Kalamazoo Central being considered strong enough to cut into the scoring heavily. If the points are divided up among all entries, the chances for one of the upstate schools to take first honors will be increased.

Lansing Has Big Squad.

squad, 20 men being named to start in the various events. Detroit Northwestern, with 15 individual athletes entered, ranks second in size of squads. More than 200 men in all have been entered by the 22 schools participating.

With good track and weather conditions, several of the standing state track and field records are expected to fall. The sensational dash marks hung up a year ago by Buck Hester, of Detroit Northern, will probably stand, but a review of the times and distances established by state high school athletes in meets this spring show that almost every other mark on the state record books will be in danger.

Preliminaries on Friday.

Detroit schools entered are: Northwestern, Northern, Central, Eastern, Southeastern, Western, Cass Tech. and Southwestern. Outside schools striving to lift first honors from Detroit entries will be: Highland Park, Owosso, Jackson, Lansing, Battle Creek, Kalamazoo, Normal High, Kalamazoo Central, Flint, Saginaw Arthur Hill, Saginaw Eastern, Pontiac, Grand Rapids South, Ann Arbor and Muskegon.

Preliminaries in all events except the mile and half-mile runs will be held Friday morning, starting at 10 o'clock eastern time, with all finals at the same hour on Saturday.
