

CHICAGO GIRLS TO RACE HERE

Windy City Enters Team for Women's Athletic Meet at Belle Isle.

Entries for Saturday Contests Will Close July 17 at Recreation Department.

Entries for the mid-west women's athletic championships, which are slated for Belle Isle, Saturday, July 13, will close Thursday afternoon at the department of recreation.

Upward of 100 girls are expected to compete in the meet, which is the first of its kind that has ever been attempted in this part of the country, sponsored under the joint auspices of the Michigan Athletic Union and the Detroit department of recreation.

Many out-of-town athletes are listed to compete in the meet. In addition to a group of Chicago girl athletes, who have been trained here under the direction of Tom Gekker, famous coach at University of Chicago, a well-balanced team is expected from Cleveland.

The list of events includes 50-yard dash, 100-yard dash, 60-yard hurdle race, running high jump, 800-yard running broad jump, shot put, javelin throw, discus throw, basketball throw and baseball throw. In addition there will be a 410-yard relay.

Women physicians will examine all contestants, who must report at the field on Saturday afternoon at 1 o'clock. A uniform consisting of breeches, blouse or sweater, knee-length bloomers and black stockings has been prescribed especially for the contests.
