

SCHOOL TEAMS IN FINAL MEETS

Track Athletes Will Complete Training For City Test During Week.

Colts and Cass Face Hard Task—Eastern Goes To Ann Arbor.

Track athletes of the various Detroit high schools will compete in four dual meets during the coming week in final preparation for the annual city championships.

The schedule is the hardest that has confronted the teams this season and calls for the lone meeting of a city squad with a state rival, Eastern meeting Ann Arbor Friday afternoon.

In the other competitions, favorites for city honors will be forced to display their best ability to avoid defeat. This is especially true of Northwestern, last year's champion, in its contest with Western. The Colts defeated every opponent easily during the season, but the Cowboys have improved considerably in the last few weeks and may furnish a surprise.

Colts Boast Star Trio.

Northwestern has several stars counted upon to take first places in the city meet and their ability will be put to the hardest test against the west siders. Widman, Tait and Carlson, however, outclass the field in their various events, the former looming as the successor to Edwin Spence as the best hurdler in high school circles.

Carlson has bettered the city mark for the discus throw and should have little trouble against Western. The Cowboys, though, boast a strong team in the field events and on this asset hope to hand the Red and Gray the first reverse of the year.

Cass Tech takes Southwestern and this test will determine the real ability of the Mechanics, who have shown the best improvement of any school in the city Gaines, Loving and Tolan are a combination that has yet to place second in their respective events.

Loving Aids Cass Tech.

Loving accounted for most of the points scored by Cass in its previous meets, specializing in the sprints and hurdles. Tolan, a newcomer in the Mechanic squad, also is available in the dashes. Southwestern will be forced to show its best form to keep this trio in check. Oldham, holder of the pole vault mark, may not be able to compete, due to his ailments with the court team.

Highland Park, following its one-sided victory over Northeastern Friday, is looked upon as a strong contender for honors. The Polar Bears clash with Northern and should experience little trouble in maintaining the pace that carried them to victory in previous tests.
