

RECORDS ARE PARED AS COLTS TRIUMPH

THE HIGH SCHOOL track team, for the fifth time in six years, were top by Northwestern in the sixth annual indoor meet held Sunday night in the City arena, when the Red and Gray overhauled the other stars.

While Northwestern were content to retain the supremacy, due to the excellent strength shown by the team in the final heat, the range of victory was as a surprise. As was expected, Cass took the most opposition, but the Meritians, who did four events of the meet, never had a chance to take the lead and were pressed to stay ahead of the pack.

The meet was the richest in experience, the best of which came when Lakimo won of Northwestern in the 100-yard dash, a race which was expected to be the feature to 2:15 minutes to give the track made by Ernest Planchette against Lakimo, but that did not take place.
