

BARRATT SETS NEW SHOT PUT RECORD

**Lansing Weight Man Only
Local Tracker to Place
In Kazoo Meet**

Lansing High school's track team did not get away to a very auspicious start on their 1925 season when they copped but one first place in the tenth annual interscholastic meet held at Kalamazoo Saturday. The meet this year took the form of a relay carnival, various relays taking the place of the individual events. More than 34 schools from three states participated.

Probably the most outstanding feats of the day were the performances in the shot put, pole vault, and half-mile relay events. In the first Barratt of Lansing pushed the ball 46.24 inches. This effort broke the former record of 44.6 inches by nearly two feet. The previous mark was held by Doyle, at present University of Michigan's leading weight man. In the pole vault Whitney of Toledo Waite cleared the bar at 11 feet 8 inches to establish a new record. The winner and Hathaway, diminutive Kalamazoo star, staged a great duel. Both made 11 feet 6 inches but he added two inches were too much for the Celery City boy and he missed. In the half mile relay Kalamazoo Central set a new mark of 1:36.3. This was good time considering the track.

Several other good marks were made but they did not quite approach the records. In the medley and sprint relays the marks made will stand as records.
