

SOUTH DOES WELL IN KAZOO RELAYS

Churm's Crew Only State
Team to Finish in Medley
Event.

CHAPMAN PLACES THIRD

Kalamazoo, May 4.—Grand Rapids South was the only state school to finish in the medley relay race in the Kalamazoo college relay meet here Saturday afternoon, the Furniture city school copping the third honors. Toledo Waite took first position, with Elkhart, Ind., second.

Churm's team made a splendid showing and if a quarter-miler had been on hand might have copped the event. Coats, a hurdler, ran the 440-yard in this race, an event new to him. Ball ran the half, Winters the three-quarters and Kingsford the mile in the medley.

In the spring relay South placed fifth. Chapman, the Grand Rapids entry in the broad jump, took third place, losing out for second honors by 7-10 of an inch.

Four new records were hung up at the meet. Zanitz of St. John's high did 5 feet, 10 inches in the jump. The former mark of 5 feet, 8.5 was made by Richards of Allegan in 1922. Central high of Kalamazoo clipped three-tenths of a second off the former mark in the half mile relay, doing the distance in 1 minute, 36.3 seconds. Froebel high of Gary, Ind., running the half in 1:38.2 in class B competition, smashed the former mark of 1 minute, 40 seconds established in 1922 by Rockford high. Whitney of Waite high, Toledo, hung up a new mark in the pole vault when he did 11.47 feet.
