

Danville Entrant Tosses Javelin For Better Rec-

ANN ARBOR, Mich., May 23—
Qualifying athletes for 15 starts in the finals today, Detroit Northwestern made good its claims to being a dangerous team in the annual Michigan Interscholastic here, Cass Tech, also, of Detroit, was the nearest competitor with men capable of starting in seven different places this afternoon. Preliminaries in the hammer throw were not contested, while the mile run will be run in che event today and the relay will be run in heats with the best time the deciding one.

While the honors of placing the largest number went to Detroit Northwestern, Whitlock of Danville, Ill., made the only new record of the

ill., made the only new record of the qualifying day, tossing the javelin 171 feet 9 inches, 10 feet better than the record he made in the Michigan meet a year ago. He had a margin of 20 feet over the man coming clos-est to his toss, also an Illinois entry, Rubendenst, of Harvey. Whitlock al-so qualified in the high jump.

So close was the competition that with the exception of Detroit North-western, but two schools were able

to qualify two men in an event.
All of the visiting athletes were entertained at a dinner at the Michigan Union last night, with the members of the Michigan Track team as their special hosts.
