

## Cass City Wins Last Two Events And Wins Triangular Track Meet

Croswell, May 25—Sweeping the final two events, including the broad jump and relay race, Cass City tracksters romped off with victory in the triangular track meet held here Saturday. The final score was: Cass City, 45; Croswell, 38; Port Huron, 33.

One county record was smashed when Gilbert, star of the Croswell team dashed 220 yards over a wind swept track carrying clouds of dust to the finish in 23 2-5 seconds, lowering the record formerly held by Henderson, of Sandusky and H. Merriman, of Deckerville by 3-5 of a second. Other records were impossible owing to the high wind, which kept the thin clad athletes shivering between events. The county pole vault record was equalled however by Conlin, of Croswell, who made the height of nine feet, seven inches.

Thirty-five athletes competed in the annual track classic from the schools of Port Huron, Cass City and Croswell. At no time throughout the meet did Port Huron threaten, it being evident from the start that the real race was between Croswell and Cass City. Until the final two events were run off, the issue was in doubt with Croswell maintaining a slight lead over the Tuscola team. Failure of Croswell to place in the broad jump and relay with the exception of third in the latter event, cost them the meet.

Gilbert, of Croswell proved high point man of the meet annexing 23 of his team's 38 points. Although Croswell secured six first places to five for Cass City, the Tuscola thin clads placed consistently in practically every event, securing seconds and thirds, if not the leading position. Few of the events were hotly contested, the half mile proving the best race of the day with Bond, of Cass City winning over Minnie, Port Huron.

Minnie surprised followers by taking the mile run in a walkaway in the time of 5:17 1-5. Showing an easy stride the Port Huron athlete romped in 50 yards in the lead of Bailey, of Cass City.

Minnie also lead his team in individual points scoring eight with first in the mile run and second in

the half mile. Scott was next high point man with seven tallies scoring two seconds and a third place.

The day was fitting for anything but a track meet, and spectators shivered in heavy overcoats, while the athletes sought warmth in numerous blankets. The meet however was termed one of the most successful ever held here from the point of closeness and keen competition. Thirteen events were run off.

100 yard dash—Gilbert, (C.) first; Scott, (P. H.) second; Hartwick, (C. C.) third. Time, 10 4-5.

High jump—Gowen, (C. C.) first; Gilbert and Wagner, (C.) tied for second and third. Height, 5 feet 2 inches.

Mile run—Minnie, (P. H.) first; Bailey, (C. C.) second; Hill, (C.) third. Time, 5:17 1-5.

Pole vault—Conlin, (C.) first; Gowen, (C. C.) second; Hurley, (C.) third. Height, 9 feet, 7 inches.

220 yard dash—Gilbert, (C.) first; Scott, (P. H.) second; Hartwick, (C. C.) third. Time, 23 2-5.

Discus—Falk, (P. H.) first; Dilman, (C. C.) second; Gilbert, (C.) third. Distance, 92 feet, 5 1/2 inches.

Half mile run—Bond, (C. C.) first; Minnie, (P. H.) second; Sacha, (P. H.) third. Time, 2:24.

220 low hurdles—Powell, (C.) first; Lindsay, (P. H.) second; Burns, (P. H.) third. Time, 28 4-5.

Javelin—Gowen, (C. C.) first; Dilman, (C. C.) second; Beale, (P. H.) third. Distance, 128 feet 11 inches.

Shot put—Gilbert, (C.) first; West, (C. C.) second; Falk, (P. H.) third. Distance, 37 feet, 11 1/2 inches.

440 yard dash—Gilbert, (C.) first; Bond, (C. C.) second; Scott, (P. H.) third. Time, 59 seconds.

Broad jump—Bailey, (C. C.) first; Lindsay, (P. H.) second; Gowen, (C. C.) third. Distance, 19 feet.

Relay race—Won by Cass City, Port Huron second, Croswell third. Time, 1:45. The winning relay team consisted of Hartwick, Moore, Gowen and Bond.
