

### TEAM BALANCE GIVES DETROITERS VICTORY

#### Colts Get But Four First Places, But Earn Points in Eight of Fifteen Events—Cass Tech Trails Winners by 9½ Points—Bill Loving Is High Individual Scorer of Meet.

ANN ARBOR, May 23.—Detroit Northwestern, piling up a total of 34 points, today took first honors in the twenty-fifth interscholastic track meet here.

The win gave the Colts permanent possession of the championship cup presented in 1922, this being their third win. Northwestern copied honors in 1921 and led for first with Detroit Eastern the following year.

Following Eastern's winning a second leg in 1923, Washington high of Cedar Rapids came in last year to put in a claim. The third victory for Northwestern today writes the dispute over the trophy.

Cass Tech of Detroit gave the Colts their hardest race in the preliminary for points, taking 28½. Davette, 11, with 17, Harvey, 10, with 10, and Kalamazoo Central, with 10, were the next nearest contestants.
