

Colts Figured as Easy Favorites in High Classic Competition in Weight Events Promises to Be Keen — Many Predict Detroit School Will Score as High as 50 Points — Under New Association

Followers of high school track activities in the state are confidently predicting that Detroit Northwestern high school will have little opposition for premier honors when it takes the field at East Lansing Friday and Saturday to compete for the track and field championship of Michigan in the class A high school division. It is predicted by some that the Colts will turn in a total of points not far from the 50 mark.

In the dashes, Tolan of Cass Tech, Tait, Ross, and Lewis of Northwestern, and Bosley of Benton Harbor are the men who will fight out the honors. Tait is favored in the century while Kaines and Tolan are the runners who should take the longer events. Craft of Lansing is a prospect in the 440 yard dash with a second place in the race at Ann Arbor. Rogers of Kalamazoo will probably give him a close run.
