

## Lansing Places Second In Kalamazoo Track Meet

**Fred Barratt Is High-Point Man of Meet  
With Total of 12—Crall Takes a First in  
440-Yard Dash**

Lansing High school's track team pulled quite a surprise Saturday afternoon when they took 34½ points to place second in the seventh annual Western State Normal track meet at Kalamazoo. Quite a number of outstanding feats marked the day's performance, chief among these being the performance of Leroy Potter of Coldwater in the mile run. Potter negotiated the distance in 4 minutes and 34 seconds. This performance was sensational. Easley of Benton Harbor set a new record of 22 and 4-5 seconds in the 220 yard run. The old record was 23 seconds, held by Bernard Otto, now of Michigan State Normal.

Burns of Niles ran the half mile in 2 minutes and 2-5 seconds. This performance is as sensational as Potter's. Wilson of Ann Arbor smashed the record in the discus when he hurled the saucer 116 feet. Barratt of Lansing who took second was also well over the old record.

Of the Lansing contingent Barratt was the outstanding performer. He was high point man of the meet with 12 points. He garnered a first in the shot when he put it 46 feet. This was five inches under the record. In the discus he placed second with a record heave. In the javelin he achieved third place being nosed out of second by three inches.

Crall was the other first place winner of the "Big Reds." He knocked off first place in the quarter mile run. His time was 53 and 1-10 seconds. George of Lansing placed fifth in this event. Killoran of Lansing copped third in the mile, while Kingscott knocked off fourth in his first half mile in competition. Davis tied for third in the pole vault. Keitchen leaped in to third place in the broad jump, while Benson was fifth. Leonard was fifth in the javelin.

Lansing placed third in the half mile relay.
