15,837 IN MEET AT BELLE ISLE

**Greatest Field Day Ever
Staged Held Despite
Stifling Heat.**

EVENTS LAST 6 HOURS

While their elders either sweltered in the heat or sought shelter from the blazing rays of the sun and the stifling breezes, 15,837 school children competed in the eleventh annual field meet held by the Department of Health Education of the Detroit Public Schools at Belle Isle all day yesterday.

More than a near century temperature was needed to curb the enthusiasm of the children of the elementary, intermediate and junior high school grades of the Detroit, Highland Park, Hamtramck and Redford schools. Highland Park, Hamtramck and Redford were competing for the first time, having been invited to join this year, bringing the total number of schools entered to 186. Plans are being considered to ask Windsor to compete next year.

For more than six hours the children were contesting for places, points and prizes in the events. Preliminary events started at 10 a. m. and the finals were not completed until 4 p. m. For the day the athletic field of Belle Isle became a tented city. Each school had at least one tent and some had two or three.

4,000 MORE ENTRIES.

This year's entry list exceeded that of last year by more than 4,000.

Interest in the meet was not confined to children. Thousands of adults, parents of the competitors, spent the day on the island and reports from the Belle Isle police headquarters estimated the crowd at 2 p. m., the starting time of the finals, at 200,000.

The meet set a new record. No track meet ever held in a single day had as many competitors. Last year's meet set a new record and that mark was far eclipsed by yesterday's competition.

IN 10 SECTIONS.

The meet was divided into 10 sections, there being city championships for both boys and girls in the following divisions; junior high, intermediate, seniors, juniors, and juveniles. Chief interest centered in the intermediate division where the Miller School again won by a big margin, due largely to the per-

formances of its numerous negro athletes. The 100 yard dash in this division brought out the most sensational feat of the day. Eugene Beatty, a negro boy, ran the century in 10 3-10 seconds. This time is considered good for college runners and is exceptional among high school boys. Beatty also is a remarkable broad jumper but could not compete in that event as each student is limited to one event and the relay.

Miller scored a total of 76 points in the boys' division while Barbour was second with 56 points. In the girls' section the victory was more pronounced, Miller running up a total of 72 points while Barbour in second place has 29.

Northeastern produced a winner in the junior high school division for the boys with a point total of 41 with Northwestern second. Their positions were reversed in the girls' section where Northwestern scored 23 points and Northeastern 28.

CLOSE COMPETITION.

In the other classes the competition was close. In the girl's juvenile section A. L. Holmes won first place by taking only the shuttle relay. Duffield took the championship in the boys' juvenile with 14 points.

Ellis, after finishing as runner-up last year, came back this year and won the baseball championship, defeating Nordstrum, 8 to 1. Stanley Starch, captain and pitcher of the Ellis team, held the larger Nordstrum boys safely throughout the game while he and Borse hit home runs that helped clinch the victory.
