

# CASS RUNNERS PLACE IN MEET

## Tolan Qualifies in 100 and Loving in Hurdles; Colts Show in Field.

STAGG FIELD, Chicago, June 6.  
—Cass Technical High of Detroit stood a good chance to gain a prominent place in the winners' column of the National track and field interscholastic at the University of Chicago today by qualifying men in nearly every one of the track events in which qualifying heats were held Friday. Northwestern High qualified in three of the four field events in which trials were held.

Tolan of Cass Tech took second place in the first heat of the second round of the 100-yard dash for high schools and will run in the semi-finals today. He took second place in the first round heat. His time in the second round heat was only a tenth of a second slower than Foster of Wenatchee, Wash., who bested him by a few feet.

Loving of Cass gave a great exhibition, placing in both the 120 high hurdles and the 220 low. In the high hurdles he had to step right along as the leader, Taylor of Sioux City came close to record time, making 15 3-5 seconds, the best done of the day. No one from Detroit ran in the 220 dash. In the field events Glenn Carlson of Northwestern High, Detroit, had no trouble qualifying in the discus and the 13 pound shot.

Clifford Robinson of Northwestern High qualified on the broad jump, the requirement of 19 feet being easy for him.
