

CASS TECH WINS DUAL TRACK TEST

Mechanics Beat Highland Park in Opener, 51-43.

Cass Tech, last year's runner-up for city and state track honors, ushered in the season Thursday afternoon by gaining a victory over Highland Park, 51 to 43.

Although handicapped by the ineligibility of three stars, Eddie Tolan, Gaines and Cunningham, Cass gave evidence of being a contender for supremacy when the city meet is held.

The Mechanics annexed six first places while the Polar Bears were restricted to four. William Loving, high point scorer at the last city meet, annexed that honor against the Polar Bears by capturing three events and competing in the relay for a total of 16 1-4 points.

220-yard run—Won by Coutts (Cass); Ramsdell (H. P.), second; Runo (H. P.), third. Time, :28 1-5.

One mile run—Won by Kaumier (H. P.); Kiehne (Cass), second; Johnson (H. P.), third. Time, 5:32 1-5.

High Jump—Won by Loving (Cass) or Sampson (Cass), tied for first; Snider (H. P.), third. Height, 5 feet 6 inches.

40-yard run—Won by Wheeler (H. P.); Sinclair (Cass), second; Warner (Cass), third. Time, 1:05 4-5.
