

# STATE TRACK AND FIELD MEET WILL BE HELD TONIGHT

**DETROIT, March 12.—(AP).—**

Efforts to bring several of the foreign athletes now in America to Detroit having failed, the annual state track and field meet here tonight will be purely a Michigan affair.

City College of Detroit, Michigan State Normal of Ypsilanti and the Young Men's Order, Detroit, will fight it out for first place. Northwestern high, city and state champions, and Eastern high also have entered men in some events.

Ypsilanti Normal, winner of the team championship last year, faces a definite challenge from City College this year. The Munies have been showing increasing class in several events and have in Kenneth Doherty an all round star upon whom they can depend for some points.

The Normal at Ypsilanti has shown probably greater progress

in athletics during the past twelve months than any other state school. At the Illinois relays the Normal team finished second in the two mile medley relay and in doing so made better time than the former carnival record for the event, stepping it seven seconds faster than the best previous time.

This same relay team has been entered in tonight's meet. It is composed of Otto and Sharoy, who do the 440-yard legs of the race. Ryan, half-miler, and Potter who runs the mile.

Otto, in addition to performing over the quarter-mile stretch, will take part in the 75-yard dash and the standing broad jump. Otto's chief track accomplishments have been in the dashes.

Detroit City College won places in two relay events at Urbana, and supporters of the school expect to see the Muny relay runners surprise the Teachers.
