

TRACK HONORS TO N'WESTERN

Colts Gain Slight Margin in Annual Invitational Meet at Ann Arbor.

Three Records Established; Marsh, of Northern, Sets Height in Pole Vault.

Ann Arbor, March 20.—(By the Associated Press.)—Detroit Northwestern topped a strong field of high school track teams here tonight to win the second annual Michigan invitational indoor meet.

Three records were smashed—the half-mile run, 50-yard dash and pole vault—and time throughout the meet was fast. Northwestern scored 21 points, 3 1-2 ahead of Kalamazoo Central, with Cass Tech, of Detroit, third, 15 1-2, and Detroit Northern, fourth, 11.

Burson, of Waite High school, Toledo, outran Teeters, of Elkhart, Ind., for a record of 2:06.1 in the 880-yard run. H. Polan, of Cass Tech, held the lead until the last 200 yards, but Burson's reserve carried him past both Tolan and Teeters.

Ross Meets Defeat.

The third event on the program, the 50-yard dash, saw the second record smashed, when G. Simpson, of East Columbus, Ohio, ran away from Ross, of Northwestern, to set a new mark. Ross, who only last year established the previous record, could not keep up Simpson's clip.

Detroit Northern, represented by Marsh, took the pole vault with a mark of 11 feet, 8 inches, a record. To win, Marsh went three inches above the best competitive mark.

Seven of 11 point-bearing events saw Northwestern's colors placed in the first four.

Kalamazoo forced the leader all the way. The medley relay, which Central won in 9:02.8, brought them into second place just ahead of Cass Tech. With the best of the relay teams, Central also took first and second in the mile.

Kalamazoo Surprises.

Following the leaders in point scoring, came Flint, Central, 6; Waite, Toledo, 6; Gary, Ind., 1; Ann Arbor, 2; East High, Columbus, 5; Elkhart, 4; Highland Park, 6; Thornton High, Harvey, Ill., 5; Detroit, Northeastern, 5; Saginaw, Arthur Hill, 5; Detroit Western, 1; Libby, Toledo, 3 and Glenville, Cleveland, 2.
