

LOVING, TOLAN EARN VICTORY

**They Give Mechanics First
National Honor With 14
Points.**

**Lack of Breast Stroker Costs
Northwestern Chance to
Land Supremacy in Tank.**

Chicago, March 27.—Two Negro high school students, unassisted today won the national interscholastic track championship at Northwestern university for Oak Tech, of Detroit, when Bill Loving and Eddie Tolan generated 14 points to gain a two point margin over Detroit Northwestern.

Northwestern suffered a like fate in the national aquatic meet when it trailed Wilmington, Del., high school by eight points with 25 to land in second place.

Aside from bringing Oak Tech the track title and first national supremacy ever gained by a Detroit school Loving was high point scorer of the meet with 11 points. During his profitable afternoon Loving equalled one of the oldest marks in the meet to win the 60-yard high hurdles, placed second in the low hurdle number and high jump. Eddie Tolan, his team mate, made victory certain when he placed second to Patterson, of Tilden Tech, Chicago, in the half century dash.

Loving Ties Record.

Two meet records were shattered and one tied. In the high jump, Miller, of Elmwood, Ill., cleared the bar at six feet and 9-16 inches to snatch first place from Loving. This feat bettered the former mark of 5 feet 11.3 inches made by Ellsworth of Oak Park in 1925. In the four fifths mile relay the Urbana, Ill., team traveled the distance in 3:47, breaking the record of 3:52.3 established by Inverfield high of Highland Park, Ill., in 1924.

When Loving leaped the barrierless in eight seconds he equalled the mark first established by Butler, of Rock Island, in 1915 and later tied by Tubel, of Cedar Rapids, Iowa, in 1924.

Craig Is Star.

Detroit athletes cut a wide swath in the meet. Northwestern advanced to the runner up position with 11 points when, from, after being shut out in the 50-yard dash, came back to win the 60-yard low hurdles with a team mate, Jake Wolman, in fourth place. Wolman also finished third in the high hurdles. In the record breaking relay race the Colts pulled up in fourth position.

ably cost Northwestern the swimming title. It was in this event that the winning team, Wilmington, Del., gained a first place that virtually decided the championship. One mark was erased during the meet when the winners negotiated the relay in 2:19.2-10. The mark set in 1924 was 2:15-10.

Horace Craig, of Northwestern, was the outstanding swimmer in the event despite the fact that his team lost. The Red Colt captured first place in the 40-yard free style by swimming the distance in 19.2 seconds and led the field in the 220-yard free style by covering the course in 2:33.4-10.
