Sandusky, Apr. 7—Croswell High school will act as hosts of the annual track and field meet of the Sanilac County High School Athletic association to be held Monday, June 7, according to the decision of school authorities in meeting here last week.

Officers of the association named include Thomas Poole, of Decker-ville, acting his third year as president of the association, S. L. Benjamin, Carsonville, vice president and Clarence Heemstra, Croswell, secretary.

determine football and basketball championships on a percentage basis was decided on, with cup trophies to be purchased and awarded in these sports in addition to girl's track. No official championship has been previously awarded by the athletic body.

The schools of Lexington and Peck were voted as reinstated in baseball. Contests with these schools in baseball were formerly not counted in the percentage column in the county race, owing to the fact that neither school could formerly place a team in the field to cope successfully with the larger schools composing the association. This year however abundant material in both Lexington and Peck influenced the action.

A ruling that each school in the association should play off all other schools with the exception of one providing such schools maintained teams in that sport, was passed by the organization, to enable the championships to be determined on an representatives abasis as possible.
