

**CASS TRACKMEN
WIN STATE TITLE**

Detroit School Noses Out Kalamazoo—O'Neal Scores Battle Creek's Points.

(By the Associated Press)

East Lansing, May 29. — Detroit Cass Tech, Kalamazoo Central and Detroit Northwestern, the favorites finished one, two and three in the Michigan interscholastic class A high school championship track and field meet here today. Grand Rapids South nosed out Detroit Northeastern for fourth place.

The scores of the teams that finished in the counting were: Cass Tech, 29½; Kalamazoo, 23; Detroit Northwestern, 19½; Grand Rapids South, 13; Detroit Northeastern, 12; Detroit Eastern, 10; Pontiac, 9; Flint Central, 8; Saginaw Arthur Hill, 6; Ann Arbor, 5; Detroit Southwestern, 5; Detroit Northern, 4; Detroit Central, 3; Lansing, 3; Battle Creek, 2 and Muskegon, 2.

Loving and Tolan, Cass Tech stars, accounted for 20 of the points tallied by the winning school. Loving won both the high and low hurdle events and Tolan led the field in 100 yard and 220 yard dashes. Gowman, of Detroit Eastern, tied with these athletes for individual points, counting all of the tallies won his school by taking firsts in the shot and discus.

Although the track was comparatively fast and the weather ideal, no records were toppled and only one was equaled. Newman of Pontiac tied the pole vault record when he cleared the bar at 11 feet 9 inches.

Battle Creek's points were scored by "Peggy" O'Neal who took a third in the shot put. O'Neal led the qualifiers yesterday, with a heave of 44 feet, eight inches, but was unable to better his mark today. The event was won by Gowman of Detroit Eastern and Dill of Saginaw Arthur Hill, was second.

Other local entrants turned in good performances but failed to break into the point column. Doliver was fifth in the 220 low hurdles, and Turner took the same position in the mile. Reed also finished fifth in the 440 yard dash. Neller did well in the 880 yard run but was just outside the points.
