

# Cass Tech Sweeps State Track Meet

**Detroiters Pull to Front on Great Work of Loving  
And Tolan-Flint Central Finishes Eighth,  
When Youngsters Meet Speedier Youths.**

**EAST LANSING, May 29.—(AP)**

—Detroit Cass Tech., Kalamazoo Central and Detroit Northwestern, the favorites, finished one-two-three in the Michigan Interscholastic Class A high school championship track and field meet here today. Grand Rapids South nosed out Detroit Northeastern for fourth place.

The scores of the teams that finished in the counting were: Cass Tech. 29 1-2, Kalamazoo 23, Detroit Northwestern 19 1-2, Grand Rapids South 13, Detroit Northeastern 12, Detroit Eastern 10, Pontiac 9, Flint Central 8, Saginaw Arthur Hill 6, Ann Arbor 5, Detroit Southwestern 5, Detroit Northern 4, Detroit Central 3, Lansing 3, Battle Creek 2 and Muskegon 2.

Bill Loving and Eddie Tolan, Cass Tech. stars, accounted for 20 of the points tallied by the winning school. Loving won both the high and low hurdles events and Tolan led the field in the 100-yard and 220-yard dashes. Gowman of Detroit Eastern, tied with these athletes for individual points, counting all of the tallies won by his school by taking firsts in the shot and discus.

**ALTHOUGH** the track was comparatively fast and the weather ideal, no records were toppled and only one was equalled. Newman of Pontiac, tied the pole vault record when he cleared the bar at 11 feet, 9 inches.

Flint Central's stars did not shine so brightly in the meet as was supposed they would. Henry Harrell did not come through in the broad jump in the style that he did at the Ann Arbor meet. Rolfe did not place at all and Bennett failed in the half mile.

Harrell ran the hundred, but the field was too fast for him and he didn't have a chance. His highest mark in the broad jump was 20 feet, 6 1-2 inches which was made in the trials Friday and which stood for today. He placed third.

**KELLEGHAN** surprised the Flint boys by staying in the discus finals and drawing fourth place with a distance of 104 feet, 5 3-4 inches. Craig did not place in the javelin, but perhaps this was because of his hard 440 run just previous to his throw. Craig ran the prettiest race of his career to win this event.

He started out third and held his place until the last curve and then opened up to win with only

about two inches to spare. Rolfe fell down both in the discus and the shot.

The relay team did splendidly considering everything. It ran the first of two heats and the company wasn't fast enough to give real competition. Ron Wagonlander went in to lead off with a pulled muscle in his leg. He got a fine start and was leading the field until about 40 yards of the first balk. At this point his leg went down, but in spite of the pain he gamely fought and made the balk behind two men. Chisholm grabbed the baton and passed the leader at the curve, and from then on it was Flint's race. Kalamazoo, Cass Tech, Detroit Northeast and Northwestern turned in faster times, however, in the second heat. The summaries:
