CASS TECH WINS STATE H. S. MEET

Lansing Places Only 2 Men to
Net 3 Points in M. S. C.
Events; Tie One Record

Cass Technical High school of
Detroit captured the track and
field championship of Michigan
Class A High schools staged at
the Michigan State college field
Saturday morning. The winners
came through with 29½ points
for first place. Kalamazoo Cen-
tral finished in second place with
23 points and Detroit Northwest-
ern was third with 19½.

Other schools finished as fol-
lows: Grand Rapids South, 13;
Detroit Northeastern, 12; Detroit
Eastern, 10; Pontiac, 9; Saginaw
Arthur Hill, 6; Detroit South-
western and Ann Arbor, 5 each;
Detroit Northern, 4; Lansing and
Detroit Central, 3; Flint Central.

Pole Vault Mark Tied

Only one record was endangered during the meet. Newman of Pontiac leaped 11 feet, 9 inches in the pole vault to tie the state record. The feature race of the day was the 440-yard relay which was won by Kalamazoo Central in 1:31.7, just two-tenths of a second shy of the world's high school record for the event.

Lansing High placed only two men in the meet. Captain Ed. Killoran placed third in the mile which was won by Kingsford of Grand Rapids South in the very good time of 4:35.8. Kline Durst placed fourth in the 100-yard dash which was won by Eddie Tolan of Cass Tech in :09.9.
