

**LOCAL TRACKMEN  
GRAB TWO FIRSTS**

Battle Creek High, with 16 Points, Finishes Fifth at Kalamazoo.

**KAZOO® CENTRAL WINNER**

Dolliver and O'Neal Take 129 Yard High Hurdles and Shotput, Respectively.

● Kalamazoo, May 8.—Battle Creek High, with 16 points, took fifth place in the Western Normal 11th annual interscholastic track and field meet here this afternoon. The meet was won by the Kalamazoo central high which amassed a total of 47 1-2 points. Grand Rapids South finished second with 22 points, Muskegon, with 20, was third, and Western Normal high, 15 1-2, was fourth.

**Two First Places**

Dolliver and O'Neal scored first places for Battle Creek, the former taking the 129 yard high hurdles in :17.4, two fifths of a second behind the track record, held jointly by Stewart of Saginaw Eastern and Weisen, Grand Rapids central, and the latter winning the shot put with a heave of 42 feet, 10 1-2 inches. Dolliver also finished second in the 229 yard low hurdles, behind Buist of Grand Rapids South, who negotiated the sticks in :37.2, equaling the record held by Haggerty of Ypsilanti. Dolliver was but a step behind at the tape.

**Adds Two Points**

Teed added two points by taking fourth place in the 440 yard dash which was won by Veysey of Muskegon in the fair time of :54 flat. Turner ran a strong race in the mile, but held back too long and finished fourth. The event was won by Kingsford of Grand Rapids South in 4:42.8. Noyes tied for third and fourth places in the running high jump.

The showing of the Battle Creek team was remarkable, considering the poor conditions under which it has been forced to train. The track at Battle Creek is in such shape that it is impossible for the athletes to run on it and they do not get on cinders except at away from home meets.
