

# MARK BEATEN BY 3 SECONDS

## Helps Club Capture Meet at Belle Isle; Y. M. O. Tied as Runner-up.

At the start of the present outdoor athletic season the Old Timers' Athletic Club was organized by a number of veteran athletes for the purpose of encouraging amateur competition. The first of the athletic events on the program was to be a series of track meets.

Two of these have already been held on Belle Isle and the athletes representing the Old Timers have carried off the honors in both.

The Old Timers scored their second team victory Saturday scoring a total of 59 points as against 40 each for the Young Men's Order and the Detroit Athletic Association. The Y. M. O. A. was fourth with 13 points. The others to score were the St. Rita Sports, 3 points, and Glencoe A. C. of New York City, 2.

The meet was marked by the breaking of one state record, the one-mile relay, by the quartet of sprinters representing the Old Timers. They ran the mile in 3:32 2-5 as against the former mark of 3:35 2-5, made by the D. A. A. last month.

Herbert Allison, anchor man on the Old Timers' relay team, was the hero of the race. When Allison started his quarter he was fully 15 yards behind Beatty, the last D. A. A. runner. By a hard sprint Allison passed Beatty in the stretch and crossed the finish line fully 10 yards in front.

The other members of the winning team were Everett Pauschert, Stanley Keyes and Buck Weaver.

There were three double winners in the meet, Kenneth Doherty of the Old Timers, Eddie Tolan of the D. A. A. and Dell Allman of the Y. M. O. Doherty was first in the broad jump and the javelin throw, besides taking a second in the shot put. Tolan took both the 100 and 220-yard dashes while Allman won the shot put and the discus throw.

Doherty lost a place in the high hurdles in which he finished second but was disqualified for knocking over three hurdles.

The Old Timers will stage another track meet on Belle Isle in August.
