Five records were broken in the meet. Lewis of Northeastern was clocked at 53.4 in the 440: Cress of Oak Park turned the half in 2:05 and then came back to set a new mark in the mile run at 4:39.8. Beauvais of Western broke the existing mark in the 60-yard high hurdles, the new time being 8.1 seconds. Oak Park concluded the record breaking performances by setting a new mark in the medley relay.

Beatty of Northeastern was the individual high point scorer with a total of 10 points. He won the low hurdles and bload jump.

Oak Park and Riverside high schools were recently combined into one school and besides holding the Michigan title, the Cook County lads also are holders of the lowa indoor title and the championship of Cook County.
