

COLTS RETAIN CITY INDOOR TRACK TITLE

Northwestern Wins Two Final Events to Gain Margin Over Northeastern.

TWO RECORDS CREATED

Cavanaugh, Colt Miler and Relay Team Shatter Records—Beatty Is High Scorer.

Northwestern retained its hold on the city high school indoor track title Saturday night against the most formidable opposition it has encountered in four years.

With two events remaining on the card the Colts had only a two and a half point margin over Northeastern and their title was in jeopardy. But corraling all of its forces Northwestern placed first in each of the two remaining events to stave off the Falcons and retain supremacy with 25 1-2 points.

Northwestern furnishing the surprise of the meet, pulled up in second place, eight and a half points behind the Colts with Westers, in third place with 17 points. Case Tech landed fourth two points behind the Cowboys. The other schools to figure in the scoring were Northeastern 4 1-2; Southwestern 4 1-2; Highland Park and Central each 1.

Beatty Is High Scorer.

Though denied the goal it had hoped to obtain Northeastern added some of the honors when Beatty secured first place in both hurdle events and placed second in the shot, but to become the high scorer of the meet with 12 points. It was his showing together with the performance of Lewis and Snowden that made the Falcons a continuous menace to the Colts.

To outstrip its rival, Northwestern gained only four first places. Secondary points, always a major factor in determining titles, stood the Colts in good stead at a time when its title hopes were fast ebbing.

Aside from annexing the championship, Northwestern also contributed two new marks. The first to pass was the mile in which Cavanaugh, one of the most consistent runners carrying the red and gray, bested Gus Rogovich, of Northeastern in 4:43 1-2. This performance clipped two full seconds from the mark established in 1924 by Rogovich, of Northeastern.

Dennis Furnishes Surprise.

Whitney, of whom the Colts expected so much, was forced to trail the field because of the heart-breaking sack set from the start. The other record to be erased occurred in the relay final event on the card, when the Colts breasted the tape ahead of Northeastern in 1:25 1-2, eclipsing the time of 1:29 3-5 established last year.

These two record breaking efforts together with victories in high jump and 220-yard dash, were the only individual titles gained by the winners. One of these victories came from an unexpected source, when Dennis topped the high jumpers with a leap of 5 ft. 3 1-4 inches. It was this victory that really gave the Colts a firm grip on the championship.

Little Dennis came through Northeastern was flung on the back of the boulevard athletes and scored a victory. But Dennis' leap removed any doubt as to the ultimate winner.
