It also took the relay, beating out Northeastern in the final event on the program. In winning the mile Leo Cavanaugh established a new city record of 4:48 1-5 surpassing the old mark of 4:50 1-5 made by Crew Couse of Northwestern in 1924. The Northwestern relay team set a new mark of 1:35 4-5 for the half-mile. These were the only records established in the finals. In the preliminaries Lewis of Northwestern broke the old record in the 440 and Jack Dant of Northwestern sent the former mark tumbling in the 220-yard dash. mark tumbling in the 220-yard dash.

# LOVETTE SETS SHOT PUT MARK

Hathaway, of Kazoo College, Adds Distance to Pole Vault Record.

EAST LANSING, Mich., March 5. (P) Brilliant running by a quartette of State College runners, bet-

tette of State College runners, better shot putting than this meet has seen before by Jack Lovette of Michigan and a new pole vault mark by Hathaway, Kalamazoo College were highlights of the seventh annual Michigan State College indoor games, here tonight.

The speedy dash men of the entertaining school not only defeated present day competitors, but also bettered the marks of former runners, setting new meet and gymnasium records in both the 440 and the 880 events. Lovette's mark was ahead of that of Miunz, mainstay of the Michigan shot put department for the last two years. Hathway, a Freshman, not only bettered all of his opponents on the floor here tonight but also had a scant fraction of an inch better mark than the former one held by Morrow, Western State Normal.

The open and matched two-mile events brought out spirited competition, especially in the open in which Western State Normal. Ypsilanti Normal and Detroit City College entered. Smith, Western, and Potter, Ypsilanti, staged a brilliant balf in their section with the Ypsiman just holding his own and then Fisher, who usually runs as a quarter miler, ran Cramer out to win just under 8:40.
