

# STATE COLLEGE TO SEND STARS

## Grim and Alderman Entered for Indoor Track Meet Here Friday.

Bohn Grim and Fred Alderman, joint holders of the world's indoor record for 70 yards, are among the entries of Michigan State College in the National Town & County Club's track meet at the General Motors Friday evening, April 8.

State College won the recent Michigan A. A. U. indoor championship, Grim capturing the Charles W. Burton Trophy as the best all-around athlete.

Alderman and Grim will appear in their specialty, the sprints, as well as in the pole vault. Besides being the record holder in the 70-yard event, Alderman also holds the mark for the 300-yard dash.

The East Lansing school will be represented in most of the events on the program. Wylie, star middle distance runner, is in the two-mile run. McAtee, state champion, is entered in the pole vault and Tillotson in the shot put. Lang, Sprinter and Warcham are in the hurdles. Kroll and Lang, members of the State College's star relay team with Grim and Alderman, may also appear in the sprints.

### FARRELL PROMISES.

Michigan State Normal College, Michigan Intercollegiate Conference champion and Detroit Y. M. C. A., city titleholders, are among the other organizations which will be well represented. Steve Farrell, coach of the University of Michigan track team, has promised some entries but they will not be known until Monday or Tuesday.

Eddie Tolan, of Cass Technical High School, city, state and national interscholastic sprint champion, is entered in the 50 and 100-yard dashes, and will no doubt be seen in action against the State College stars. Others in the short distance races are Gordon Hester, Bernard Otto and Leighton Body, Michigan State Normal, Eugene Beatty and John Lewis, Northeastern High and Charles Sargent of the 'Y.'

Charles Foster, Detroit 'Y', state champion and record holder, is entered in the one-mile walk in which eight contestants will start. Robert Mundle of the 'Y' will compete in the 1,000-yard run in which he holds the state crown. Andrew Lewis, champion and holder of the state record, and Chauncey White will be the city's chief contestants in the two-mile run. R. H. Callahan, formerly of Michigan, is another favorite in this race.

### FAVORED IN SHOT.

Del Allman, Irvin Wolfe and Tillotson are favored in the shot put, while McAtee of State College and Al Thorpe of Ypsi Normal stand out in the pole vault.

There are large fields in the standing broad jump and two specialties, a sack race and a three-legged race.

John H. Pattee will act as referee of the meet. Charles D. Lynch will be the starter, Paul Robert, announcer; Fred Lawton, chief track judge; Carl E. Johnson, chief field judge; L. M. Post, chief timer and Carroll Trego and Robert W. Standart, inspectors.
